Dear Sirs,

I am pleased to present you with the report on the actions undertaken by the Santander Bank Polska Foundation in 2020.

This was undoubtedly a difficult year for all of us. We faced an enemy that we hadn't known before. This required a change of the work system and a creative approach to tasks we delivered: both business and social ones run by the Santander Bank Polska Foundation.

This year, in an attempt to meet the needs of Polish hospitals triggered by the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, we decided to provide financial support to hospitals that are engaged in the combat against the virus. We launched the charity fundraiser "We Will Double Your Impact" that gathered over 15 thousand of participants. Its objective was to raise funds to buy medical equipment and protective gear necessary in the fight against the pandemic for 23 hospitals in Poland. At the beginning of the campaign, Santander Bank Polska Foundation joined its forces with Santander Bank Polska and we donated PLN 2 million. At every stage of the initiative, we matched every zloty donated. In the end, we managed to provide Polish hospitals with over PLN 5 million.

At the same time, we were thinking about children oncology hospitals. As part of the "Power to Help" ("poMOC jest w nas") fundraiser, PLN 200 thousand was donated to 10 Polish pediatric oncology centres by the Foundation, the Bank and its 613 thousand of customers who made over three million BLIK transactions. The hospitals used the funds to purchase the necessary medical equipment used for everyday diagnostics of the youngest patients.


2020 was another year when the Foundation got involved in initiatives aimed at protecting environment and climate by launching the grant programme "Eco-friendly Here I live, here I make ECO changes." Within the programme, 68 NGOs received subsidies for their environment-friendly actions. The programme has over 200 000 beneficiaries, whose actions contribute to improving the world around us.

Also, in the school year 2020/2021, as many as 23 talented students received scholarships from the Foundation. We are really proud of them and happy that we can support their passion and talent.

The above actions were made possible thanks to the support of the growing number of volunteers (currently there are over 2 500 of them). In 2020, we organised 75 volunteering initiatives. I wish to thank all the volunteers, especially bearing in mind that 2020 saw the 35th anniversary of adopting the International Volunteer Day by the United Nations General Assembly.

Paraphrasing the words of the patron of our Foundation, Ignacy Jan Paderewski, good and stable results are achievable only thanks to continuous, everyday efforts. A real success... is conditioned by systematic work. And this is everyday work of all the volunteers and employees that conditions the success of the Foundation. On behalf of the Board of the Foundation and my own, I want to thank you for your engagement and efforts.

The beginning of 2020 came as a surprise to all of us Nobody thought that the Covid-19 pandemic would change our lives so dramatically...

Exactly. The pandemic surprised all of us. In February, together with our volunteers, we organized a charity campaign for children suffering from cystic fibrosis. During a one day-long workshop, volunteers created some useful items for a charity fund-raising campaign for the Polish Society for Fighting Cystic Fibrosis (Polskie Towarzystwo Walki z Mukowiscydozą). For March, we have already prepared another campaign together with the Unum Foundation for the beneficiaries of the Foundation for the Rescue of Children with Cancer (Fundacja Na Ratunek Dzieciom z Chorobą Nowotworową) that was combined with the celebration of Women's Day. Together with the students of the Cardinal Stefan Wyszyński University in Warsaw, we planned to sew heart-shaped pillows that support the rehabilitation of patients after mastectomy.

Unfortunately, the campaigns never materialised. On March 16, 2020, the first lockdown due to the epidemic was announced in Poland, which turned all plans upside down...

As we know, after a momentary stop, when we first had to rearrange our life and work, the Foundation's team already had some ideas how to act in the new reality...

It was even before we got used to the home-office work that our volunteers had already known what to do. Hospitals, aid centres and orphanages were short of face masks... It started with one volunteer, and finally over 100 people across the country sewed over 13 000 face masks without leaving their homes.

And then there was "We Will Double Your Impact" organised together with Santander Bank Polska with over 13 thousand people involved. Thanks to the great heart of the bank's customers and other donors, we supported 23 coronavirus hospitals all over Poland. Our next action was "Power to Help." We supported 10 oncology centres for children all over Poland, helping the pupils to recover and go back to a normal, joyful life.

We listen to the needs and, according to our capabilities, try to help, motivating others to act. The support was especially important at that time

The time of pandemic, remote learning and home closure was a difficult time for children and young people. The lack of contact with peers was even more conducive to the feeling of insecurity. It was a particularly difficult time for students who were preparing for their high-school final exams and had to choose where to continue their education. But even in this area, the Foundation came to the rescue.

Of course, bearing in mind that children and young people are a group that is especially important to us. The high school graduates were in a difficult position. After a period of happy proms, they were locked in their homes, not even knowing the exact date of their final exams. During the hottest period for them, they were learning remotely. And there came the idea for Korki.TV., an educational programme for high school graduates. The programme was prepared by Metro TV, and we supported its implementation. Korki.TV have been appreciated and awarded with a prestigious "Tytanowe Oko" award.

In addition, in liaison with Santander Universidades, as part of cooperation with selected universities from all over the country, we prepared a guide for high school graduates, presenting various fields of study and related opportunities.

The Foundation also thought about teachers and younger students. In 2020, together with UNICEF Polska, the Foundation launched a project aimed at teachers...

Yes, this project is an innovative proposition for teachers working with students from the 4th grade of primary school. Young people often have amazing ideas for social activities but they just lack space and resources to implement them. We provided the tool recognizing this potential.

TO(działa)MY! is a very special project. It provided opportunities for young people to act in the areas of ecology, health and sport, as well as education and entertainment. First, students, under the supervision of teachers, prepared projects, and then they could apply for funding under the Foundation's grant competition. Most of them concerned ecology. It proves young people are sensitive and they

care about the environment. Out of the submitted projects, the jury selected 30, which received support in the amount of PLN 2 000. Despite the difficult situation and remote schooling, over 730 institutions from all over Poland joined these activities.

This was also the third time when we invited students to our scholarship programme. They are all very special young people. We have been following their development and we are happy with each success.

In line with our mission, we think about the future and therefore we invest in young and ambitious people who want to develop but also want to change the world for the better through their actions. And we're there for them to help.

Volunteers could not be as active as in the past due to the situation in the country, and yet the red T-shirts with a beating heart – the hallmark of the Foundation's volunteers – have not disappeared...

Nothing will stop our volunteers from doing good, we have only adapted our activities to the new situation. A good example of this is the "Northern Helps" charity run organized together with the Northern Macroregion of Santander Bank Polska, which this time took place in a virtual formula. 1855 people took part in it, and they traveled the 7.1 km-long route running, cycling, on horseback, roller blading, on roller skates or scooters. During the campaign, we managed to collect over PLN 63 000, which we donated to the Fr. E. Dutkiewicz Hospice in Gdańsk. A big event ending the year was the Christmas Tree Campaign, supporting care and education centres all over Poland. Volunteers donated decorated Christmas trees to selected institutions and together they created Christmas tree decorations, bought gifts for the pupils or organized entrepreneurship lessons with Santa Claus.

These are just two examples but there were many more of these actions. Our help was available to seniors, children, disabled people, young people - children from orphanages who needed support when entering the labour market.

Ecology is a particularly important issue for the Foundation. Eco-friendly activities should be part of our lifestyle. To support this trend, the Foundation for the first time announced a new "ECO-FRIENDLY. Here I live, here I make changes" grant programme.

Eco-friendly lifestyle and actions should become a habit of each of us. Organizations operating in local communities have an important role to play here. To support them, we have given a new ecological profile to the grant programme "Here I live, here I make changes," which has been in place for several years.

And it was a huge success. Over 800 applications were submitted in the first first edition. We were impressed with the ingenuity of the applying organizations. Thanks to our support, rain gardens, pocket parks, ecological murals and green public transport stops were created. We want the space around us to encourage relaxation and we make efforts to see more and more green places. We know that we have a real influence on our planet and we motivate others to act together for its good.

What activities does the Foundation undertake in 2021?

In our activity, we choose areas that are in line with our mission and contribute to a real change. The most important thing is that thanks our projects someone's life improves, new opportunities for further development are created, and local communities are activated to improve the quality of life in their village, town or neighbourhood.

Among the projects we will carry out in 2021 there are three grant competitions, the scholarship programme, as well as some new, friendly spaces for children in hospitals and orphanages in the Klub Płomyka project. We also want to help children's and adolescent psychiatry departments. We have just finished the "We Will Double Your Impact" fundraiser organized together with Santander Bank Polska Group, from which the entire income, together with additional money donated by the bank, will support the above-mentioned goal. Our volunteers still continue sending us their ideas for more activities. We have a lot of plans and we are eager to deliver new challenges. We are glad that our programmes and projects can support local communities, eco-friendly and health-promoting activities, support gifted students and help medical institutions.

I would like to thank the Foundation Board, employees, volunteers, and all organizations cooperating with us, for their commitment and support. Your help is irreplaceable.

And in a year's time we will be celebrating our 25th anniversary...

Over 15 thousand people joined the charity fundraiser organised by the Foundation and Santander Bank Polska S.A. whose aim was to collect funds to buy medical equipment and protective gear for 23 hospitals in Poland. At the campaign opening the Bank donated PLN 2 million to 8 hospitals and then matched every zloty paid by donors. Thanks to the received funds, hospitals could by, among others, protective equipment, ventilators, oxygen pumps and other equipment necessary to protect health and rescue patients during the Covid-19 pandemic.

Power to Help

Total amount transferred to hospitals: PLN 200 000

Number of hospitals that received support: 10

Between 14 September and 5 October 2020 the Foundation and the Bank organised a charity campaign to help children oncology centres and engaged customers of Santander Bank Polska. The Bank donated 5 groszy for every BLIK transaction made by customers. 613 thousand customers took part in the campaign, making more than 3 million BLIK transactions. Those who wanted to help could also make donations to a special account opened for the sake of the campaign. PLN 200 thousand were raised for hospitals all across Poland to buy the necessary medical equipment used for everyday diagnostics of the youngest patients.

Program for students April – May 2020

The Foundation supported financially an educational programme Korki.tv created by the Metro tv and addressed to matura-exam takers. Mathematics, Polish language, biology, chemistry, history and English lessons were developed by teachers, enthusiasts of modern ways of teaching, in accordance with the current core curriculum and the guidelines of the Ministry of Education. The authors of the programme made sure that the formula was attractive and easily accessible for students. The recommended length of a lesson was 20-25 minutes. The classes were aired on Metro TV from Monday to Friday and were also available on VOD player.pl.

The cycle was developed to support the youths during the difficult times of the pandemic in their preparation to exams.

Korki.TV and the TVN Discovery Group (owner of Metro TV) have been appreciated and awarded with a prestigious "Tytanowe Oko" award for the support provided to students during the coronavirus pandemic.

Objective of the programme

In 2020, the "Here I live, Here I make changes" grant programme was presented in a new, eco-friendly version. Hence the new name "Eco-friendly Here I live, Here I make changes". The aim of the programme is to introduce eco-friendly changes in local environment, environmental education and integration of residents.

The jury of the competition especially appreciated the original ecological initiatives responding to the social needs. It was important that the project was carried out in public space and was available to everyone.

For whom

The authors of the applications could be organizations that have legal personality and operate in the local environment such as foundations, associations, schools, kindergartens, municipalities, libraries, community centres, country clubs, local administration units or even voluntary fire brigades. Anyone could submit their idea, it only had to encourage one of the above-mentioned institutions to cooperate and submit an application.

Projects

The projects included creation of vertical gardens, pocket parks, rain gardens, green libraries and public transport stops, plant murals, educational gardens at schools and kindergartens, as well as renovation of several hundred-year-old wells and many others actions.

Implementation of the projects contributed not only to changing the appearance of the area but also to a change in thinking about ecology, e.g. thanks to workshops on ecology.

Objective of the project

The aim of the project is to increase social engagement among children and adolescents; draw attention of the young generation to the needs of their immediate surroundings, and build awareness of young people in areas related to ecology, health and education.

In the 2020/2021 school year, the first edition of the TO(działa)MY! Project implemented by the Santander Bank Polska Foundation in cooperation with UNICEF Polska, began.

The project is an innovative proposition for teachers working with students from the 4th grade of primary schools. The initiative gives opportunity for young people to act in areas that they find important and interesting. The project also made it possible to obtain funding for the implementation of a social project prepared by students.







What is the project about?

The project "TO(działa)MY!" consisted of two parts: obligatory and additional one, implementation of which was planned for the 2020/2021 school year.

As part of the project, young people, under the supervision of a teacher, formed teams in which they prepared social projects in an area of their choice:ecology, health and sport, and education and entertainment.

These are issues that young people deal with on a daily basis. Students developed and implemented a project that would serve schools or more broadly - the local community.

In the second part of the project, the institutions involved could apply for co-financing for a selected project. In 2021, the top 30 projects assessed by the competition jury received a grant of PLN 2 000 financed by the Santander Foundation. The delivery of the projects is underway.

In 2020, during the pandemic, despite the general concern about Covid-19 infections, volunteers from the Foundation organised and joined voluntary initiatives. The project is aimed at educating students from the last grade of primary and secondary schools. Santander Bank Polska is definitely the leader among all the banks involved.


The project covers lessons with presentations on four topics: "Your money," "Borrow carefully," "Smart investing," and "Finances for life." A cycle of four lessons covers comprehensive information about the world of finance for a youngster who is just starting their adult life.

When the schools were closed due to the pandemic, preparations to running online classes started. After training for volunteers and adjusting the class scenarios to webinars, the lesson programme was launched mid-April. Cybersecurity class was a pilot one.



EDU@CTION

Edu@ction is a series of online classes run for students of primary and secondary schools and teachers by the volunteers of the Fundation. 163 students participated in 18 meetings. The subjects discussed included::



- Financial market: no secret
- Cybersecurity
- Jobs of the future
- How to enter labour market

Apart from the students, 100 teachers participated in the classes. During five meetings, they learnt about different personality styles which is to help them in their work with students.

Educational games

Santander Bank Polska Foundation launched two board games which helped volunteers to conduct ecology and economy classes.

Eco-competition


Eco-competition is a social educational project of the Foundation. Its main aim is to educate primary and secondary school students and promote knowledge of ecology, environment protection and waste management.

Volunteering

Północny Pomaga 2020 – online charity run

26 September 2020

Number of participants: 1855

Collected amount: PLN 63 448





This was the third time when the employees from the Macroregion North in cooperation with the Santander Foundation organised a charity run, this time in a virtual form. It gathered 1 855 participants who had to run 7.1 kilometres: a symbolic route from the registered office of the Macroregion North to Hospicjum im. ks. E. Dutkiewicza in Gdańsk. The objective was to raise funds for the hospice which takes care of ca. 390 adult patients per year.

The Members of the Management Board of the Bank also took part in the race. Each participant had to run 7.1 km. Together, they covered a total distance of **13 170 500 metres** running, riding a bike, a horse or a scooter, rollerblading or rollerskating. The total amount raised was **PLN 63 448.08** (start fees and donations made to the benefit of the hospice).

Volunteering competition: "Charity Leaders" ("Liderzy Dobroczynności")

August - December 2020

To wake up the potential in volunteers, the Foundation organised a competition called Charity Leaders aimed mainly at inspiring one another within charity initiatives.

To participate, you had to come up with an original idea which would meet the sanitary conditions applicable in Poland during the pandemic times and file an application. Out of 33 projects that were sent in the competition, the jury selected 13 that received a grant (PLN 1 500). Another stage of the competition is the delivery of the awarded projects, recording a video showing ideas being implemented and selecting the best initiative. The winners will pick any social objective to which the Foundation will donate PLN 3 000. Due to the restrictions caused by the second wave of the pandemic, some initiatives and the final results announcement have been postponed to 2021.

Christmas tree initiative

December 2020

The Foundation, together with volunteers, organized a nationwide Christmas campaign addressed to the charges of care and educational institutions throughout the country. As part of the campaign, volunteers donated decorated Christmas trees to selected institutions, they also made Christmas decorations, bought Christmas gifts for those under their care and organised entrepreneurship lessons with Santa. We supported over 30 centres.





10 best volunteering initiatives

in 2020



Otuleni w kwiaty (Nestled in flowers)

Coordinators: Monika Krupka, Edyta Zamelska

The volunteers supported the seniors from the "Wygraj siebie" association and joined their efforts to develop a project "Otuleni w kwiaty." The project assumed providing flowers to seniors' houses and organising flower arranging workshop. The project was completed with creating an album with flower arrangements and portraits of people participating in the project, dressed in black, that were a symbol of those suffering from cancer. This was a continuation of the project that had its first wave in 2019 and was co-financed by the city of Leszno.



1. Region w Toruniu jest EKO (Toruń region is ECO)

Near Ptock, there is the biggest refinery in Poland. And hence the city and its vicinity have a major problem with the quality of air. As we know it, trees are necessary to have clean air. This is why volunteers planted trees from the forest nursery Nadleśnictwo Ptock in Brudzeń near Ptock. The volunteers want to continue the project in the upcoming years.



Higiena lasu (Forest hygiene)

Coordinators: Ewelina Hałuszka, Marzena Makieła

The volunteers took care of a part of Książański Park Krajobrazowy near Świebodzice. They cleaned the forest and collected the rubbish. The area is popular among the local inhabitants, so the cleaner it is, the nicer the time spent there..



Mini szpital dla zwierzaków (Mini-hospital for pets)

Coordinator: Anna Paszek

An animal adoption centre, "Przytul Pyska" in Boguszyce, was granted a camping trailer where a minihospital was created. Minor surgeries can be performed there; it will also be a place for animals to recover in perfect conditions. Volunteers cleaned the trailer and adjusted it to the needs of a hospital; they bought a new worktop, and to install a first-aid kit there, they organised a campaign to collect bandages, sterile dressings and other necessary equipment. And this is how a mini-hospital, "Szpital na cztery łapy", was established.



Bankolonie (Day camps)

Coordinator: Agnieszka Pietroń

The volunteers, in coordination with the Wrocław Townhall, participated in the organisation of day camps for children from Zespół Szkolno-Przedszkolny in Wrocław. A wide array of activities was prepared for 70 participants: singing classes, making bracelets, ceramics classes, sport tournaments, soap bubbles, rowing, aerobics, macarena dance classes. All the classes were organised in a sanitary regime. At the end of the programme, each participant received a minigift and a T-shirt with a logo of the Foundation.



Tylko koni żal... (Fundraiser for horses)

The volunteers from the 1st Region in Ostrów Wielkopolski organised a campaign called "Tylko koni żal" whose beneficiary was Fundacja Tara - a horse shelter in Piskorzyna. In the times of the sanitary regime, the shelter was deprived of any income whatsoever, so that the volunteers organised a fund raising for the purchase and transport of 20 bales of hay. The also supported the process of unloading it and transporting it to the barn.



Owoce Doliny Słońca (Fruits of Dolina Słońca)

Coordinator: Daniel Wiśniowski

In the therapeutic and rehabilitation centre for the intellectually disabled, Dolina Słońca in Radwanowice, almost 50 volunteers planted 60 bush fruits (raspberries, blackberries, blueberries). They posted a label with a name of the charge, saying "Take care of me and water me" at every bush. Each bush had a personalized letter attached to it as well. The charges will take care of their bushes and when the time comes, volunteers and charges will meet up to collect fruits together. The project was awarded the title of the best voluntary action of the year organised by the Foundation. "Dolina Słońca" is a centre run by the "Mimo Wszystko" Foundation established by Anna Dymna.



Zbiórka krwi w Kłodzku (Blood drive in Kłodzko)

Coordinator: Dominika Lis

During the pandemic, blood needs increased and there were fewer blood drives. The volunteers organised a blood donation campaign. They invited citizens from Kłodzko and they donated blood themselves in a mobile point of the Regional Blood Centre in Wałbrzych. The supported the organisation of the process, they registered donors, provided them with soft drinks and made sure that the rules of sanitary regime were observed. Over 12 litres of blood were donated.



Jak wejść na rynek pracy (How to enter labour market)

Coordinator: Marta Marciniuk

The volunteers from the Employer Branding Office from the Recruitment Team conducted an online workshop "How to enter labour market." The workshop gathered young people, charges of orphanages from all over Poland. The volunteers taught the participants how to write a curriculum vitae, prepare for an interview, they talked about the Temporary Work Agency and spoke about how and where to look for a job of your dreams. They also talked about voluntary work as an invaluable experience you can get before you start your professional career.



Lekarstwo na nude (Treatment for boredom)

Coordinator: Magdalena Majewska

The volunteers contacted a hospital library in Świdnik; they bought a new library trolley to transport books to hospital wards (till then, an old medicine trolley was used to do that). In March, a carpenter made a tailor-made colourful trolley and book shelves. The volunteers organised a fundraiser in Bank's units in Lublin under the motto of "Cure for... boredom." They collected board games, jigsaw, office supplies for creative works, and books: all that for the youngest patients. The things were donated to the library.

The Foundation together with Santander Bank Polska S.A. has implemented the Santander Universidades programme, in place in Poland since 2011, which is aimed at active support to the university community all over Poland. Santander Universidades focuses on supporting the development of students, young scientists and university employees by co-financing research programmes, international exchanges, IT, internships and scholarships.

Last year, as part of the programme, numerous online projects were carried out under the slogan #ZainwestujWSiebie and #ZostańWDomu in cooperation with the best Polish and foreign universities and research centers such as London School of Economics, British Council, Ironhack, Massachusetts Institute of Technology. The projects were developing digital, business, linguistic and soft skills.

We took active part especially in two projects carried out in cooperation with Santander Universidades:

Academic kick-off with Santander

It is a project aimed at high school final year students. Its aim was to help young people find their dream field of study. As part of the project, an online guide was developed, presenting various fields of study at selected universities all over Poland.

Santander Universidades Online Academy

It's a series of webinars organized in cooperation with the University of Economics in Krakow. It was a series of nine lectures delivered by 18 speakers from the top management of Santander Bank Polska. The event was concluded with a lecture by the CEO, Michał Gajewski. All lectures have been made available at www.santander.pl/akademia. The initiative was designed to inspire young people to develop and indicate possible career paths, key skills of the future and trends in the financial market. 800 students from over 70 universities were involved in the project.

Education projects

4th edition of the Entrepreneurship and Financial Education Convention

10 March 2020, the Copernicus Science Centre in Warsaw



Santander Foundation was the main partner of the convention. It is the most important annual meeting in Poland devoted to discussion, exchange of experiences and establishing cooperation in education in the field of finance, cybersecurity and entrepreneurship. It was attended by nearly 300 people representing various circles, i.e. representatives of public institutions, local governments, universities, schools, NGOs as well as the financial sector and the media. The Foundation together with the Province Police Headquarters in Poznań presented a project addressed to seniors called "Cyber Safety for Seniors" ("Seniorzy samodzielni i bezpieczni w sieci"). It was recognised with the Golden Banker 2020 award by Puls Biznesu. The Foundation was awarded in the category of the most active bank for its "Bakcyl" Project.

The convention was held under the auspices of the Ministry of Finance, Ministry of Development, Ministry of Digital Affairs, as well as the National Bank of Poland, Polish Financial Supervision Authority and the Banking Guarantee Fund. The convention was organised by the Warsaw Institute of Banking in cooperation with the GPW Foundation and Fundacja im. Lesława A. Pagi, and the Financial Market Development Foundation was a supporting partner.

Otylia Swim Tour project

27 September 2020, Zatoka Sportu in Łodź

As part of the project, the Olympic champion Otylia Jędrzejczak conducted classes for over 300 children. Otylia Swim Tour is a series of one-day workshops organized throughout the country for children aged 10-14, parents and coaches. The project was aimed at education and promotion of sport and a healthy lifestyle. There were also panels with a sports psychologist for parents on motivating young players, a dietitian on the principles of proper sports nutrition and with the Olympic medalist herself on the proper development of careers of talented youth.



Cultural project

5th edition of DANUTA RINN FESTIVAL

20 November 2020, online Final Gala, Dom Kultury Kadr in Warsaw

DANUTA RINN FESTIVAL is a nationwide artistic event that is part of the calendar of important festivals, cultivating the best traditions of Polish song - its mission is to commemorate the exceptional artist Danuta Rinn, as well as instill interest in culture in young people.

In 2020, Danuta Błażejczyk, founder and president of the "Appetite for Culture" Foundation which organises the festival, celebrated the 35th anniversary of artistic activity. That is why the festival edition was called "2 Danuty i ich nuty", and its young participants sang songs of both singers.



Charity project

Miejska Mila: 2nd relay race in Stary Browar

30 August 2020, Stary Browar Shopping Centre in Poznań

#Pracowni@ Programme

Number of beneficiaries: 1310

Project budget: PLN 2 361

Objective of the programme:

#Pracowni@ programme is aimed at free-of-charge donations of second-hand computers to educational establishments, sport clubs and NGOs. The donated hardware is to support educational activity and statutory operations.

As part of the programme in 2020, due to the transition to remote work, we managed to support eight organizations, including: schools, orphanages, a hospital, care and educational institutions, foundations and associations. We donated 49 computers.

Projekt Klub Płomyka

(Płomyk reading rooms)

The project has been running since 2019. Its main idea is to create colorful and cozy playrooms and places of rest for the charges of hospitals, orphanages and educational centers. As part of the project, the Foundation renovates selected rooms and provides necessary equipment, furniture, toys, books and games.

So far, four such multi-functional rooms in hospitals have been created in Gdańsk, Kępno and Piaseczno and in Specjalny Ośrodek Szkolno–Wychowawczy im. W. Kikolskiego in Białystok. In another two centres, renovation works began in 2020: in Dom Dziecka "Nadzieja" and Uniwersytecki Szpital Kliniczny im. Jana Mikulicza in Wrocław.









Cyber Safety for Seniors

The project that the Foundation has been running for several years is aimed at educating seniors about safety on the Internet and in everyday life.

Cyberspace presents many opportunities, but also threats. Communication, education, entertainment, shopping, financial services - we can do it all online. The important thing is to do it safely and to follow the golden rules of security.

Seniors are a group that is particularly vulnerable to frauds. And this is why, to meet the needs of older people, the Foundation organizes a series of workshops on safe use of the Internet and electronic banking services. We have now modified our programme and we are ready to conduct online workshops. The script and all the materials were prepared by volunteers. Educational materials for seniors are available and can be downloaded from the Foundation's website

As part of the educational activities carried out by the Foundation and the Police, projects aimed at seniors have been developed. They include "Happy Senior", "Grandparent scam/ Police Officer Scam" ("Na wnuczka, na policjanta"), "Seniorze nie daj się!", "OLABOGABABCIU", "Czas Seniora" and others.

In 2020 the Bank won the Golden Banker Award in the Socially Responsible Bank category for the Cyber Safety for Seniors Project.
