Dear Sirs,

I am happy to present you with a report summarizing the 2022 initiatives of the Santander Bank Polska Foundation.

This is a special year when we developed our flagship social projects and we also celebrated our 25th anniversary. Over this time, we have managed to achieve a lot by providing help and support to the needy ones.

The Foundation has been delivering charity actions since 1997. At first, we were operating as the „Pomoc Ludziom” Foundation at Bank Zachodni, then as Bank Zachodni WBK Foundation, and currently we are operating as the Santander Bank Polska Foundation.

Our actions are aimed at supporting local social initiatives and we help the needy ones. It is key for us to provide education for children, teenagers and students. Our mission is delivered, among others, through projects such as Santander Universidades, Scholarship Programme, numerous grant programmes and employee volunteering.

Santander Universidades supports universities and academic circles by offerings scholarships, grants and development programmes. The Foundation's Scholarship Programme supports talented students who, thanks to the funds, have a chance to develop their hobbies and talents. These are great young scholars, sportsmen, musicians, artists and polyglots, as well as representatives of many other disciplines. The youngest scholars are only 13 and they are already successful in Poland and abroad. We are immensely proud of them.

Our engagement in supporting the youngest talents is also reflected by the fact that the first grant programme of the Foundation was addressed at children and teenagers – it was Bank of Children's Smiles (Bank Dziecięcych Uśmiechów). I remember this programme very well, because it was developed as a result of a referendum conducted among the Bank's employees in 2004 and it is still organized. The Foundation has recently used the funds to subsidize support initiatives for children and teenagers whose mental health was affected during the pandemic.

In 2010, along with a new mission of the Foundation, another grant programme was established: Bank of the Ambitious Youth („Bank Ambitnej Młodzieży”). It is aimed at showing young people that their initiatives influence not only their own lives, but also the future of the local environment and communities.

Other scholarships were organized to support health and physical development of the youth, such as Bank of Young Sports Champions ("Bank Młodych Mistrzów Sportu"), and to develop local communities. Since 2022, the "ECO friendly: here I live, here I make changes" programme has been particularly focusing on eco-friendly projects.

The Foundation is also involved in organizing help and support on an ongoing basis. During the pandemic, we organized a fundraiser, we launched an initiative to sew masks, and the outbreak of war in Ukraine marked a starting point for supporting the refugees. Thank you for your disinterested help and devoting your time to those who need it. This is an invaluable gift.

Summing up this year, on behalf of the Board of Foundation, I would like to thank Marzena Atkielska and the Team, as well as all our Colleagues-Volunteers from the Bank. Thank you for your initiatives, ideas and engagement. I wish you many more years of fruitful cooperation.

On behalf of the Management Board of the Bank, I wish to thank all the NGOs, units of territorial government, hospitals, universities, educational units and all the organizations that cooperate with the Foundation on an ongoing basis.

I also wish to thank all my Colleagues from the Foundation Board for this time of intensive efforts and for your contribution to developing charity initiatives.

I hope you will enjoy the report.

**Wioletta Obuchowska**

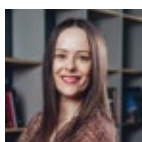

Project and Administration Expert

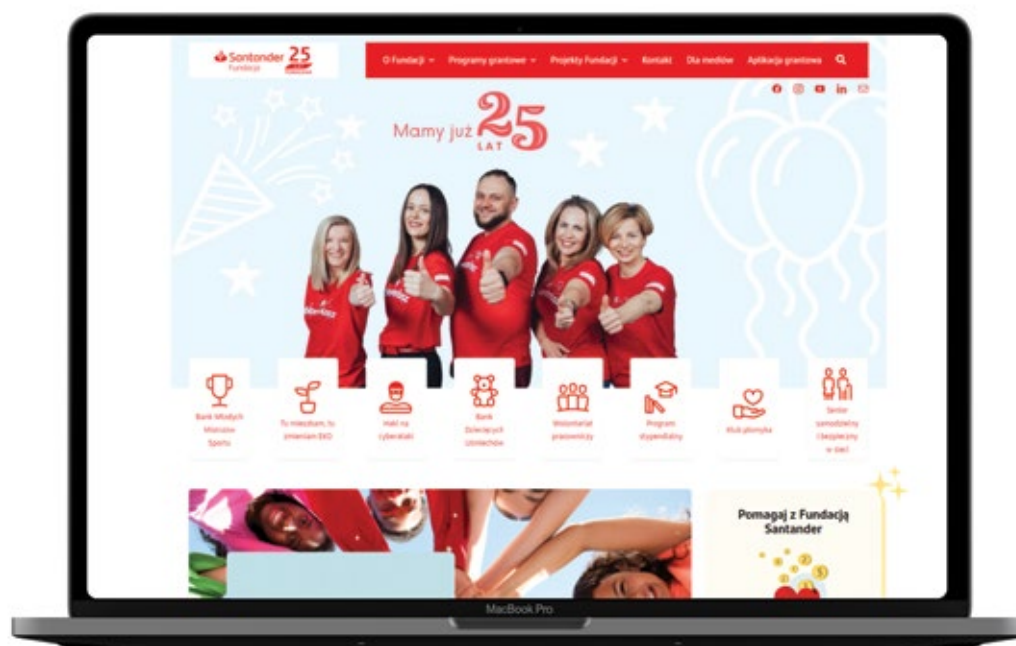

A world-famous pianist and composer, an outstanding politician and statesman, a man of many talents. He was not only an outstanding pianist and composer, but also an orator, polyglot, philanthropist, businessman, patron of art and architecture. From 1919 he was the prime minister and minister of foreign affairs of the Republic of Poland. He became famous not only as an outstanding statesman and piano virtuoso but also as a composer of stage, orchestral, chamber and solo pieces. He composed over 70 pieces of music. Since 2018, he has been the patron of the Santander Foundation.

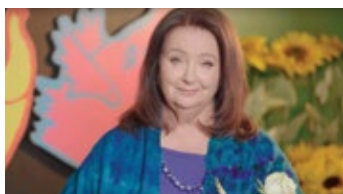
I would like to thank the Members of the Board of the Foundation, the employees, volunteers and all the organisations that work with us for their invaluable help and support.

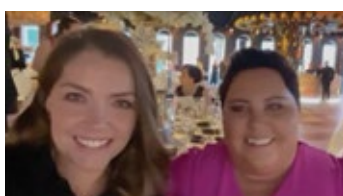

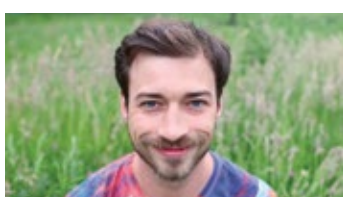

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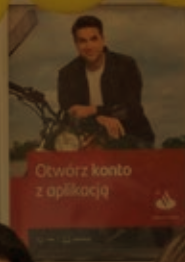

Supporting Ukraine

We Will Double Your Impact and supporting Ukraine

In response to the war in Ukraine, Santander Foundation together with Santander Bank Polska developed aid programmes aimed at supporting Ukrainian employees, customers and any other people affected by the war. The cyclical initiative "We will double your impact" in 2022 was devoted to supporting Ukraine. 26,5k people donated funds which totalled over PLN 4.25m. In Poland, Santander paid PLN 1.5m to double the donated funds. Cash went to the organisations coordinating support: Polish Humanitarian Action, Stowarzyszenie Polski Komitet Narodowy UNICEF, Polish Red Cross. Also, donation was granted to the city of Przemyśl.

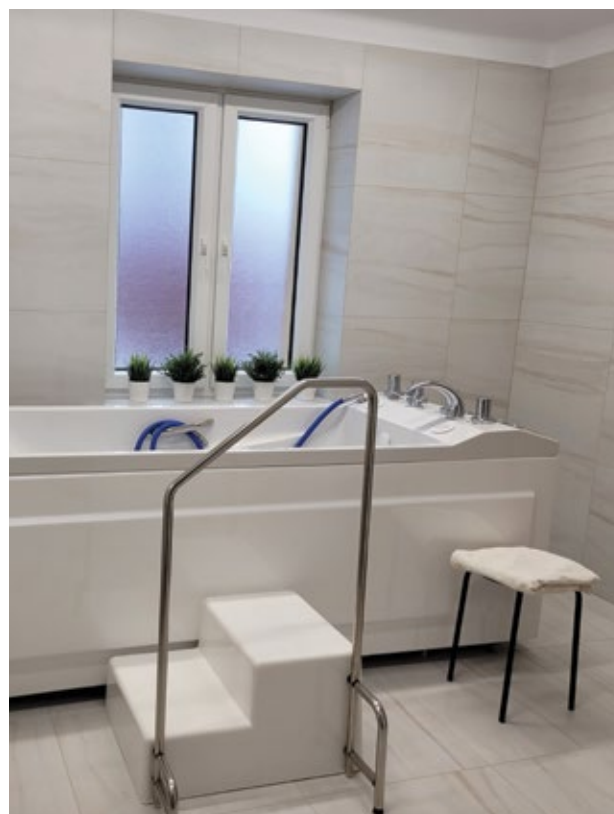
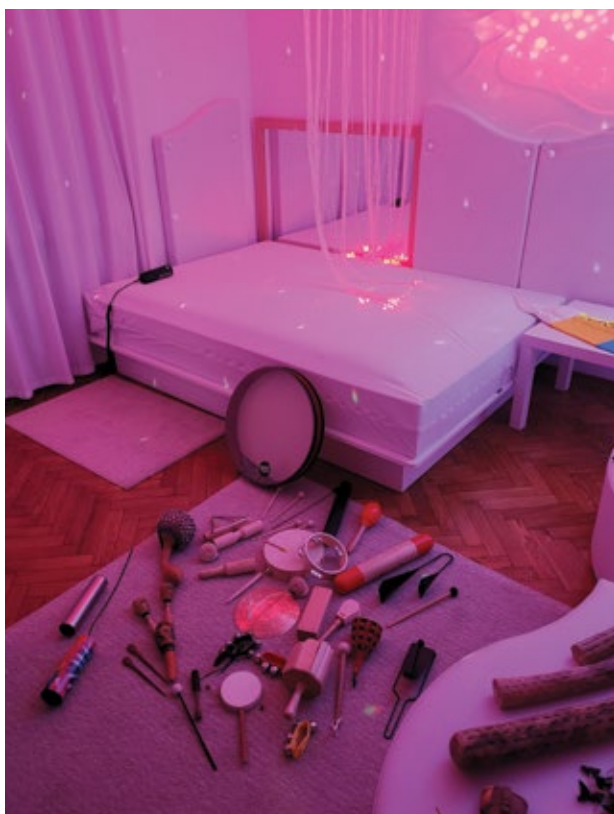

The 2022 concerts in Trzebnica and Kalisz engaged children and teenagers from Poland and Ukraine.

Among the parties invited to cooperate, there were the Santander Foundation, Starostwo Powiatowe in Trzebnica, Lasy Państwowe, Parafia św. Jadwigi Śląskiej w Trzebnicy, Stowarzyszenie Mieszkańców dla Trzebnicy and Liceum Ogólnokształcące Nr 1 in Trzebnica.

„It only makes sense when we do it together”

My role in the charity concert “Bo świat to my”, apart from coorganizing it (based on conceptual work, meeting with partners, acquiring sponsors, taking participants to castings and concerts, distributing leaflets and invitations), was to organize and conduct fundraisers. Both in Trzebnica and Kalisz, thanks to cooperation with partners of the project, I managed to gather a group of volunteers and together with them, we collected funds in shopping centres and prior to the concerts... In effect, in Trzebnica we collected PLN 12,7k and in Kalisz, 5.8k. I think that the funds collected are important, but for me, personally, it was cooperation that mattered the most in the unprecedented context of war just across the borders of our country. It may sound lofty, but this is how I feel.

19 May 2022



In May, our volunteers met children from Ukraine in the Humanitarian Aid Center in Nadarzyn. Stories for children both in Polish and Ukraine, playing together, making balloon figures with Patrycja Lipińska and many other things were organized for children by Polish and Ukrainian volunteers – employees of Santander Bank Polska.



180 refugees from Ukraine flew to Spain with the help of the Santander Group

Together with Santander Bank Polska and the Spanish Embassy in Poland, the foundation also helped with the relocation of refugees from Ukraine to Madrid. Santander Group chartered a plane to transfer 180 Ukrainian refugees to Spain. Polish and Ukrainian volunteers worked at the PTAK Humanitarian Aid Center in Nadarzyn and at Warsaw Chopin Airport, helping Ukrainian families and individuals prepare for the flight

We were dealing with a real humanitarian catastrophe that no one expected. The situation was extremely serious. Thousands of people had to flee their homeland, leaving behind all their possessions. Every single contribution counts. Employees of Santander Bank Polska from the very start of the war were involved in supporting refugees, often taking those in need under their roof. The Bank also joined relocating refugees to Spain, helping with filling in asylum applications to the Spanish Embassy in Poland, as well as in transport from Nadarzyn to the airport in Warsaw. In addition, accommodation in Madrid was provided for the refugees. Our volunteers, Ukrainian bank employees helped with translations in order to make it easier for Ukrainian citizens to deal with formalities related to both departure from Poland and later in Spain.

I also wholeheartedly committed to helping. I was very emotional when I saw thousands of terrified people, mainly women with children, staying at the PTAK Humanitarian Aid Center in Nadarzyn. At that time, only help mattered and business matters receded into the background. People with disabilities, who in such circumstances needed help the most, are close to my heart. Once again, I would like to thank everyone for that support and invaluable help.”

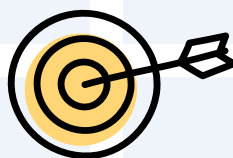

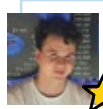


Aleksandra Dąbrowska, 18 years old, Białystok

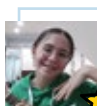


Amelia Kudasik, 17 years old, Nowy Targ

The clothes, in the total number of over 2000, were collected in Warsaw, Poznan, Lublin and Wrocław and the initiative proved to be very successful.

Fundacja Program Pomocy Pierwsza Praca runs a clothes bank in Warsaw and organises workshops „W dobrym stylu do pierwszej pracy” for young people raised in orphanages who are entering labour market.

During the workshop, the participant receives: self-confidence and image training, styling lessons and business clothing collected during campaigns such as this one.

The Clothes Bank is available to children from orphanages from all over Poland and young people can choose a wardrobe for themselves free of charge.



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Christmas tree initiative

December 2022

In the pre-Christmas period, the Foundation's volunteers carried out a number of initiatives related to the celebration of Christmas. They all fitted in the Christmas tree initiative. Volunteers visited over 35 institutions, where they made decorations and decorated Christmas trees, they prepared Christmas Eve dinners, and organised purchase of gifts for the pupils under their care. In total, they met with nearly two thousand people, incl. residents of orphanages, social welfare homes and seniors' homes. Over 100 volunteers took part in the initiative.

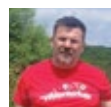

On 1 February 2020, the Department of Pediatric Surgery and Urology was moved to a new location at the University Clinical Hospital at ul. Borowska. This coincided with the beginning of the Covid-19 pandemic. We had renovated rooms for the patients of the clinic. Unfortunately, we lacked a play corner where children, deprived of their everyday home environment, could spend their free time together with their carers during the breaks of the planned diagnostic and therapeutic process and forget about the unpleasant moments associated with stay in the hospital. We had a suitable room but it required financial expenditures that the hospital could not afford. This is when Santander Bank Polska Foundation came up. The help we have received exceeded our expectations. All activities related to the creation of the play corner, starting from the project, through its implementation, providing contractors and equipment for the corner, were organized by the Foundation. The only thing to do was to observe how quickly and efficiently the place that has become the informal center of the Clinic was being created. From the early morning you can meet our patients who do not have to stay in the hospital bed, they can enjoy the toys and equipment in the room. The room is used not only by children but also by parents who need a moment of rest and relaxation from the stress of their child's illness during their stay in the hospital. On the day when the Płomyk reading room was solemnly opened in the presence of representatives of the Foundation and hospital administration, we timidly mentioned the problem of the waiting room, or rather the lack of it, for children admitted to the clinics. To our great joy, representatives of the Foundation expressed their willingness to continue cooperation and help. We did not expect such generosity but in a short time a waiting room of dreams was created; it really helps children forget about the fact they are waiting for the doctor's appointment. Just like the play corner, the entire process from concept development, through its design and execution, was organized and carried out by staff of the Santander Foundation. The help provided by the Foundation is fully in line with our assumption „We turn your gift into children's smile". On behalf of the entire staff of the Department of Pediatric Surgery and Urology, I would like to thank you once again for what you do and how you do it.
